## Women, Infants, and Children's Program (WIC)

WIC is a nutrition education program that provides nutritional counseling, breastfeeding support, education, nutritious foods, and referrals to health care services. WIC improves the health of pregnant, breastfeeding, postpartum women, infants, and children up to age 5.

### How do I apply?

When applying for Medicaid or SNAP, you can also apply for WIC.

- **✓** Proof of Identity and Kentucky Residency
- ✓ Household incomes that are equal or less than 185% of the federal poverty level
- ✓ Pregnant woman or infant in your household receives Medicaid, SNAP or KTAP













# Special Enrollment Period for Pregnancy

Beginning January 1, 2025, persons who have a **medically confirmed pregnancy** will be eligible to enroll in a **Qualified Health Plan** outside of Open Enrollment through a Special Enrollment Period.

- ✓ Individuals must attest that they are pregnant, and that this pregnancy has been confirmed by a medical provider.

- This Special Enrollment applies to the pregnant person, **and** any individual who is eligible for coverage because of their relationship to the pregnant person (spouse and/or dependents).

Citizens who have Medicaid may not be aware their Managed Care Organization (MCO) may have value-added benefits! Not every MCO has the same benefits, but below are samples taken from all of the different benefits our MCO's may offer.\*



#### **Telehealth**

24/7 access to Telehealth services



## Healthy Activities & Well-Child benefits

Money towards child well-care visits, vaccines, and gift cards for completing preventative services



## Digital Scale and Blood pressure Monitor

Health tools such as scales, blood pressure monitors, and glucose meters



#### Maternal Health

Money towards cribs, car seats, Doula services, diapers, or many other offerings
