

Medicaid Enrollment: Jan 2023 through September 2025 Renewals









September 2025 Renewals By Age






September 2025 Child Renewals

Stay Covered: Renew Your Medicaid!



Every 12 months Medicaid members will go through a renewal process to make sure they are still eligible for coverage. Keep your information updated!



A renewal notice is sent at least **45 days before** the due date with instructions and a deadline to submit required information. A reminder is sent about **15 days** before due date.



You can check your renewal month by logging into the Kynect portal or calling the Kynect line. kynect.ky.gov or call 855-4kynect (855-459-6328). Providers also have access to the renewal date in KYHealthNet.



Send in requested information **right away to avoid losing coverage**! If coverage is terminated, reach out within 90 days to submit information to **reactivate** the case. If outside the 90 days will need to **reapply**.







State Based Marketplace Updates

Enhanced Tax Credits

- Financial Assistance (Tax Credits) that lower insurance costs through Marketplaces like kynect will be substantially reduced because of current federal law
- Renewed push to US Congress to act this month
- KHBE emphasizing the value of obtaining, using, and keeping health insurance even if/when monthly contribution toward premiums rise.

Plan Year 2026

- Reminder that **Open Enrollment** with be **November 1, 2025 through January 15, 2026** with no changes to passive renewals/auto re-enrollment.
- All Bronze, Expanded Bronze, and Catastrophic Plans through kynect will be compatible with private Health Savings Account

Expanding Medicaid Home & Community-Based Services for Individuals with Serious Mental Illness



~1915(i) RISE Initiative~

New Medicaid benefit under Kentucky's 1915(i) State Plan

Designed for Medicaid-eligible adults (18+) with Serious Mental Illness (SMI), with or without a co-occurring Substance Use Disorder Brings 10 essential Home and Community-Based Support (HCBS) services into communities



1915(i) RISE Initiative Recent Developments

- We recently certified our first provider, with 12 more currently in the review process.
- 100+ potential providers have registered to begin the Certification Application process.
- 150+ potential providers have registered for two "Office Hours" sessions each week, 3:00-4:00pm (ET), Mondays & Wednesdays. A quick Zoom registration allows you to attend any or all future meetings.





Reentry Status Update



1115 Reentry Program

Eligibility	Settings	Services		
All adults and youth who would be eligible for Medicaid if not for their incarceration.	 Department of Corrections (DOC) State Prisons. Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) Youth Development Centers (YDCs). 	 Case management 60 days prior to release and 12 months post-release. Medication-assisted treatment (MAT) with counseling for individuals diagnosed with a substance use disorder (SUD) 60 days prior to release. 30-day supply of all clinically-required prescription medication and, if applicable, an order for durable medical equipment (DME) immediately upon release. 		

Program Updates:

- Program design for the delivery of pre-release services is ongoing, including work group discussions
 with the DOC, DJJ, the Department for Community Based Services (DCBS), and MCO partners.
- The Project Team is actively working to ensure system alignment across all platforms with systems testing occurring through 2025.
- DMS will continue to collaborate with Justice partners regarding the credentialing process with Managed Care Organizations (MCOs).
- Provider training and readiness will continue through 2025 into early 2026.



Consolidated Appropriations Act (CAA) Section 5121

Targeted Case Management (TCM) 30 days prior to release and for at least 30 days after release.

Program Updates:

- The State Plan Amendment (SPA) has been approved for CAA Targeted Case Management (TCM), and for Screening and Diagnostic Services.
- The Alternative Benefit Plan (ABP) SPA is currently in progress.
- The CAA Grant has been awarded, with the state kick-off call scheduled for August.



1915(c) Community Health for Improved Lives and Development (CHILD) Waiver



What is the 1915(c) CHILD Waiver?

Community Health for Improved Lives and Development

- The CHILD Waiver is a new Kentucky Medicaid program designed to help Kentucky children and youth with significant behavioral health or developmental challenges get the services they need, while staying at home, in school, and in their communities.
- Anticipated January 2026.

Serving Children & Youth with Most Complex Needs

- Focused on children and youth stepping out of acute inpatient care or at risk of out-of-home placement due to requiring intensive behavioral health and residential supports.
- CHILD waiver includes clinical therapeutic services designed to foster a step-down approach, coming from the highest level of care to return to home and the community.



Who does the 1915(c) CHILD Waiver Help?

Children and Youth

- \circ Under age 21.
- With significant behavioral health or developmental needs.
- Kentucky children and youth who:
 - Need a level of care like what would be provided in an inpatient facility, intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID), or hospital.
 - Can be safely supported at home or in the community with the right services.

	Case Management	Community Living Supports	Environmental and Minor Home Modifications	Planned Respite for Caregivers	Supervised Residential Care	Clinical Therapeutic Services (Step-Down and After Care Support)
Description	Case management activities include assisting participants in gaining access to waiver services and other needed services through the Medicaid State Plan and other non-Medicaid funded community-based programs to support the participant's home and community-based needs.	Community Living Supports are intended to provide direct one-on-one assistance (including hands-on assistance, reminders, cueing, observation, and training) while facilitating independence and promoting integration into the community.	Environmental and Minor Home Modifications are any necessary adaptations to a private or family residence required to ensure the child or youth's health, welfare, and safety.	Respite services are provided on a short-term basis due to the absence of or need for relief of the primary caregiver.	Supervised Residential Care is targeted to children and youth who require 24-hour intense residential services, and the supports provided in a Supervised Residential Care setting are individually tailored to assist with the acquisition, retention, or improvement in skills related to living in the community.	Clinical Therapeutic Services is approved, based on assessed needs, to support children, youth, and their families in understanding, mitigating, and providing long term solutions for behavior challenges. This service is designed to provide family crisis prevention and stabilization supports to the waiver enrolled child or youth, primary caregiver, family (including foster care families).

House Resolution 1 (119th Congress) Update



Rural Health Transformation Program

Overview

- \$50 billion to be given out across federal fiscal years 2026 2030 (\$10 billion per year).
 - \$25 billion (half) to be shared among states that are awarded the funds **based on an application**.
 - \$25 billion (half) to be given to states **based on factors** such as their rural population, number of rural health facilities, and other state rural health needs.
- Applications are due November 5, 2025 only one application per state.
- Grant funds will be awarded by December 31, 2025.

Program Goals

- Make Rural America Healthy Again: Improve disease prevention in rural areas.
- Sustainable Access: Help rural providers become long-term access points for care.
- Workforce Development: Improve the health care workforce in rural areas.
- Innovative Care: Improve health outcomes and health care in rural areas.
- **Tech Innovation**: Promote use of technology for health care in rural areas.
